Hi Stefano,

yes, list styles are hidden by default (in widgets) 'cause Customizr display something different from the common list-style's "icons".

To show the bullets in your custom ul, write it like:

```
 and in the css write this rule :
.my-custom-ul li {list-style: initial;}
```

With the same method (so using a css class for that speciful, you can also use an id to uniquely identify it) you can display a different "icon" for your items, even using images, or using the pseudo element ":before", there are a lot of resources on the web about this $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{S}}$ Consider also that Customizr already loads genericons and entypo fonts, so you can use them to style your list.

To see the css he uses, use some tools like google-chrome inspect elements (embedded in google-crome) or <u>firefox's extension Firebug</u>, and look for the pseudo-element :before
